DESCRIPTION:

Planned and built with a modest budget, the Club de Golf Les Boisés de Joly offers an exciting course presenting golfers with many options and characteristics often associated with scottish links courses. Open to winds and built on sandy soils, the course offers playing conditions that are firm and fast, with large expanses of fescue grasses that create attractive contrasts of colours and textures.

The course was designed with minimal earthworks to redirect surface run-off water towards a series of man-made pond built to store water on site for irrigation purposes. Environmental protection measures were also implemented to protect the site's groundwater table.
